

BritRail Information

BritRail GB Consecutive Pass (bookable for non-UK residents only)

- Rail travel throughout England, Scotland and Wales
- Available on all trains part of National Rail Network

• Consecutive Pass – valid for a set number of days in a row. For example, if you start using a 3-day pass on Monday, it will be valid until Wednesday (included).

• Once booked, the pass will be directly sent to the hotel in Glasgow or in London – clients will be able to pick their passes at the hotel reception when they check-in.

• Validating the pass: on the first day you clients wish to use the pass, clients must present this to a National Rail ticket office and ask them to date it with the date of validity. THE

PASS WILL NOT BE VALID UNLESS THIS IS DONE.

• Please advise at the moment of the booking: flight details, all names for all passengers and time of booking

- ONLY valid for standard class and off-peak travel Monday to Friday on trains departing after 09:15 (Edinburgh/Glasgow) and on any service at the weekend (*Upgrades to First class are not available*)
- Please kindly note that this pass in non-refundable, non-amendable and non-exchangeable once booked.

Questions often asked by guests:

Do I need to make seat reservations?

It is not essential to reserve seats on all trains. Generally speaking, it is only really necessary to make reservations if you plan to travel on a popular route (e.g., London to Edinburgh) at a peak time (e.g., Friday at 18.00). To make a reservation with a BritRail Pass you need to take your BritRail Pass to the station that you are going to travel from and the travel centre will make the seat reservations for you (for a small fee)

Can I use the BritRail Pass on the tube?

BritRail Passes are not valid on London Transport Underground trains or buses. To travel on the tube, you will need either an Oyster Card or a London Travelcard.

Can I use my BritRail Pass on the Heathrow/Gatwick/Stansted Express?

Yes, you can, but please be aware that this will be considered as a day of travel. The passes are not valid on the airport transfers by bus

Where can I find train timetables?

For information regarding train times, please click on <u>www.nationalrail.co.uk</u>. This is a really useful website for planning trips by train in the UK. All you need to do is type in where you want to go from and where to, with the date you intend to travel and it will bring up all the details you will need (times, changes if needed, facilities on board etc.).

Which trains are generally included in the BritRail passes?

All train services part of the National Rail network (Virgin Trains West Coast, Virgin trains East Coast, East Midlands Trains, Great Western Railway, Abellio Greater Anglia, Northern Rail, First Trans Pennine Express, Cross Country, Scotrail, Arriva Trains Wales, Chiltern Railways, London Midland, South West Trains, c2c, Abellio Greater Anglia, South West Trains, Great Northern, London Overground, Mersey Rail, Southeastern Trains, Southern, Thameslink)
